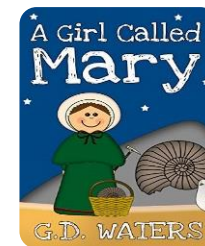
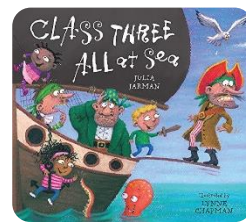

SCIENCE – Materials

KNOWLEDGE BANK:

- Object- a thing that can be used. For example, a door, chair, car, table are all objects.
- Materials are what an object is made from.
- Soft If something is soft, it is easy to cut, fold or change the shape of.
- Stretchy - can be pulled to make it longer or wider without breaking.
- Shiny- Reflects light easily.
- Dull doesn't reflect light. Doesn't look bright or shiny.
- Rough If something is rough, it feels and looks uneven or bumpy.
- Smooth objects have no lumps or bumps
- Bendy things can be bent easily into a curved or folded shape
not bendy If something is not bendy, it can't be bent easily into a curved or folded shape.
- Waterproof If something is waterproof, it keeps water out it keeps things dry. Not waterproof materials let water in.
- Absorbent- If something is absorbent, it soaks water up. Not absorbent If something is not absorbent, it does not soak up water.
- Transparent objects can be seen through.
opaque. Opaque objects can't be seen through.

KNOWLEDGE BANK:

- London is the capital city of the UK. It is the largest city in England
- England: England is the largest country in the UK. London is the capital city.
- Scotland: Scotland is a country in the north of the UK. Edinburgh is the capital city.
- Northern Ireland: Northern Ireland is the smallest country in the UK.
- Wales: Wales is a mountainous country in the west of the UK. Cardiff is the capital city. Wales has its own language (Welsh). Not everyone there speaks it though.

Who was Anne Bonny? Anne Bonny is famous as one of few women to become pirates. Said to be as tough and fearless as any pirate, she stood alongside her shipmates in many a battle. She was friends with another female pirate called Mary Read. Anne acted and dressed just like a male pirate and was excellent at fighting. To be accepted as a pirate, Anne Bonny had to wear men's clothes and pretend to be a man! Anne was the girlfriend of a pirate Calico Jack, who she ran away from Ireland with at age 16 and later married. Anne Bonny fought on a famous pirate ship called Revenge that was captained by pirate Calico Jack. Working together, Anne, Mary and Jack spent several years in Jamaica where they captured many small vessels and amassed massive treasure together.
